### 3. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

The minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 11th July. approved with one amendment: Chair: Cllr Fry

#### 4. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Following recent incidents in local communities concern was raised regarding the potential for Travellers to use the Playing Fields. Consultation with WCC and Police indicates Marton as low risk. Agreed Police Hub signage to be reinstated at Pavilion. Has been done.

Request for electric feed from street light for Christmas lights, not feasible. Cllr Chambers to discuss possible use of LED lighting (battery powered).

Community Transport: Cllrs Chambers/Fry/Lummis to support early discussions. Kick off meeting 27/09. Sustrans Project old railway line: Funding will allow work to continue which will include demolition of old bridge at end of Field Farm Lane and the erecting of the new bridge over the A432. The movement of heavy equipment on the path will necessitate its closure until the end of the year because of health and safety concerns.

New Houses: Concerns raised regarding the sewers being able to cope with the addition of new dwellings. Agreed to monitor.

- 8.5 Grass Cutting. General concern regarding poor communication. Andy Webster who has asked that single point of contact should be Parish Clerk. Whilst she is away contact needs to be made to arrange overdue cutting, bailing and hedge trimming. action: Cllr Chambers.

- 9.6 Marton Practical Ecology Group (MPEG). Thanks to volunteers who gathered hay from wildflower areas. There have been two visits over the last two months, a Biodiversity expert and the Woodland Trust. Both very happy with the progress. Costs of scythe hire for wildflower cutting voted on and agreed.
